## FOREWORD

This study of public libraries, conducted as a part of the Library General Information Survey (LIBGIS), is the first such survey since the publication of *Statistics of Public Libraries, 1974* by the National Center for Education Statistics (NCES).

The LIBGIS program was initiated in 1970 by NCES with the publication of *Planning for a Nationwide System of Library Statistics* and was developed in close cooperation with the American Library Association (ALA) and its statistics committees.

The data in this publication cover basic statistics on library collections, staffing, expenditures, receipts, loan transactions, and physical facilities. They are arranged by region, population served, and position in the Standard Metropolitan Statistical Areas (SMSAs). The survey instrument provided the same content as the previous survey instrument in order to permit comparison, and was disseminated and collected through the cooperation of 50 State agencies and the District of Columbia.

Appreciation is expressed to the American Library Association, State Library Agencies, and to other cooperating organizations that made this survey possible.

## HIGHLIGHTS

- There were 8,456 public libraries in the U.S. in 1978.
- Over 8.5 million people visited their local public library each week.
- Public libraries expended over \$1.4 billion.
- Sixty percent of all public libraries spent less than \$50,000 per year.

## STATISTICS OF PUBLIC LIBRARIES, 1977-1978

The National Center for Education Statistics (NCES) collected these data on public libraries during 1977-1978 as part of the second LIBGIS (Library General Information Survey) of the 1970 decade. Comparisons and percentages of change have been developed from this survey and its predecessor LIBGIS I to show what changes have occurred. The public libraries surveyed were those serving all residents of a given community, district, or region, at no cost, and receiving financial support, in whole or in part, from public funds. In addition to the tax-supported municipal, county, and regional public libraries, included were privately controlled libraries, which render, without charge, general library service to a community. The public library was further defined as being governed by a single board of trustees or authority, and administered by a single director. The public libraries described above are considered central or main libraries. These central libraries and other outlets such as branches, bookmobiles, other mobile units (collections which are transported and rotated by the main library) and other outlets, such as those in shopping centers, hospitals, nursing homes, etc., are considered public service outlets.

### Public Service Outlets

The total number of public service outlets for all public libraries in 1978 was 70,956. Libraries serving over 500,000 persons decreased their public service outlets by 24.1 percent, those serving 250,000 to 499,999 increased by 5.7 percent, and those serving 100,000 to 249,999 persons decreased by approximately 15 percent.

The total number of central libraries in the larger population categories of over 100,000 persons did not increase, but the number in each "population served" category shifted slightly due to demographics. In the "population served" category of 500,000 and over, the number of central libraries increased from 50 to 54. In the category of 250,000 to 499,999, the number of central libraries decreased by 3 libraries, and among those serving 100,000 to 249,999, there was a decrease of 1 central library. Central libraries serving over 500,000 persons increased their branch libraries by 9 percent and those serving 100,000 to 249,999 increased their branch libraries by approximately 7 percent. No change occurred in the number of branches for libraries serving a population of 250,000 to 499,999, although they showed an 11 percent increase in bookmobile stops. Bookmobile stops decreased by 16 percent for libraries serving over 500,000 persons, and 18 percent for those serving 100,000 to 249,999.

Other service outlets of the larger libraries serving a population of over 100,000 persons, decreased by more than 36 percent, showing a considerable reduction in service to hospitals, nursing homes, shopping malls, etc. The largest reduction of these services occurred in libraries serving over 500,000 persons. For details see basic tables 6 and 7.

#### Library Staff

About one-third of the data collected for this survey was on library staff. A total of 93,335 full-time equivalent (FTE) staff was reported in the following three categories: (a) professionals, (b) technical, clerical, and other staff, and (c) plant operations and maintenance. The professional staff was over 41 percent of the total FTE staff, equaling 38,702 persons, or approximately 4.5 per library. The technical, clerical, and other staff consisted of 48,209 persons or over 51 percent of the total staff, and the plant operation and maintenance staff totaled 6,424 or over 6 percent of the staff.

#### The Professional Staff

The total professional staff has grown over 7 percent. Women comprised 84 percent of the professional staff and showed a growth of 6.2 percent. The number of male professionals has increased 12 percent since 1974.

Nationally there has been an increase of over 50 percent in the professional staff of rural libraries serving 100,000 to 249,999 persons. However, without regard to locale (SMSA), this size category of library had only a 10 percent increase in

professional staff. In libraries serving 250,000 persons and over, the professional staff decreased by 26 percent in suburban areas and increased by over 16 percent in urban areas. Nationally, libraries of this size showed an increase of over 13 percent in their professional staff. In suburban libraries serving 50,000 to 99,999, the number of professional librarians has decreased by over 18 percent, but the number has increased by over 16 percent in suburban libraries serving 10,000 to 49,999 persons. Urban libraries have increased their professional staff by over 11 percent.

## Earned Degrees of Professional Staff

Since 1974, the number of librarians with less than a bachelor's degree decreased by 9.6 percent, with a considerable drop occurring in libraries serving less than 100,000 persons, especially in those libraries serving less than 10,000 persons.

Librarians with graduate degrees increased by over 22 percent and with graduate degrees in librarianship by over 18 percent.

### The Graduate Degree

The most dramatic change has been the substantial increase of librarians with graduate degrees. The number of graduate librarians has increased from 16,930 in 1974 to 20,704 in 1978. In 1978, over half the professional staff in all public libraries had graduate degrees. In libraries serving over 500,000 persons over three-quarters (76.5 percent) of the staff were graduate librarians. Those libraries serving less than 100,000 persons showed a much larger percentage of their staff with graduate degrees than in 1974. Libraries serving 10,000 to 49,999 persons employed 40.9 percent more graduate librarians than in 1974 and libraries serving under 10,000, 98.5 percent more. In suburban areas, libraries serving populations of 10,000 to 49,999 and under 10,000 increased their graduate

degree staff by 42.5 percent and 106 percent respectively. In rural areas, libraries serving 10,000 to 49,999 persons increased their graduate staff by almost 45 percent.

#### The Graduate Degree in Librarianship

The number of librarians with graduate degrees in librarianship has increased by 3,011 librarians with library degrees. In libraries serving a population of under 10,000, the number has increased over 94 percent. For libraries serving between 10,000 and 49,999, the rate of growth has been 39 percent. In 1974, the number of librarians, whose graduate degrees were in librarianship, was 16,341 or 96.5 percent of the graduate degree staff and in 1978, the number increased to 19,352 or 93.5 percent. Although the number of librarians with graduate degrees in

librarianship has increased since 1974, the proportion of graduate librarians with library degrees to those with other graduate degrees has decreased.

### The Bachelor's Degree

Nationally, the number of librarians with bachelor's degrees has not changed significantly during the 4 year period, 1974-1978. Large urban libraries serving a population of over 250,000 showed some increase in librarians with a bachelor's degree, however those urban libraries serving 100,000 to 249,999 showed a decrease of over 8 percent. Suburban libraries serving 100,000 to 249,999 and 500,000 and over showed decreases of over 20 percent and over 14 percent respectively. The apparent percent changes for libraries serving under 100,000 persons are due to sampling errors.

#### Less than a Bachelor's Degree

Noticeable changes have occurred since 1974 in libraries serving a population of 100,000 and over. An increase of librarians with less than a bachelor's degree has occurred in large urban libraries serving over 100,000 persons of 37 percent and has decreased by 87 percent in large suburban libraries serving over 250,000. Urban libraries have increased their employment of librarians with less than a bachelor's degree by 93.4 percent in libraries serving 500,000 and over, and by 58.5 percent in libraries serving 250,000 to 499,999. In suburban libraries, the employment of librarians with less than a Bachelor's degree has decreased by 94 percent in libraries serving 500,000 and over and decreased 76.8 percent in those serving 250,000 to 499,999.

#### Technical, Clerical, and Other Staff

All public libraries employed a total of over 48,000 technical, clerical, and other staff. Libraries serving 500,000 and over reported over 14,000, those serving 250,000 to 499,999 reported over 4,700, and those serving 100,000 to 249,999 reported over 7,400.

#### Plant Operation and Maintenance Staff

Approximately 6,424 plant operation and maintenance staff were employed in public libraries in 1978. No significant change has occurred during the 4 years between 1974 and 1978. There was an average of less than one plant operation and maintenance staff person per library. For further details see basic tables 8 through 11.

#### Library Receipts

Over \$1.5 billion were received by all public libraries during FY 77, an increase of nearly 35 percent since the last survey in 1974. Receipts increased by \$404 million from FY 74 to FY 77. Library receipts were from local, State, Federal, and other sources such as gifts and donations. Local receipts were \$1.170 billion, state receipts \$103 million, Federal receipts \$122 million, and other \$166 million. The distribution of these monies was as follows: 74.9 percent from

local sources, 6.6 percent from State sources, 7.9 percent from Federal sources, and 10.6 percent from other sources which included gifts and donations of money from all sources. The urban public libraries were recipients of 33 percent more funds in FY 77 than in FY 74. Suburban libraries received over 36 percent more funds, and rural libraries increased their income by 39 percent.

Public libraries serving a population of 100,000 and over received over 31 percent more funds in FY 77 than in FY 74. These libraries received 56.7 percent of the total receipts in FY 74, but in FY 77 they received only 55 percent. Libraries serving populations of 100,000 to 249,999 increased their receipts by 40.3 percent. For smaller libraries serving less than 100,000 persons, the increase in funds was approximately 40 percent. Libraries serving 10,000 to 49,999 persons increased their receipts by 45.3 percent, and those serving under 10,000 increased their receipts by approximately 36 percent.

Federal support to public libraries was administered through two main programs: Revenue Sharing and the Library Services and Construction Act (LSCA). Federal Revenue Sharing distributed over \$57 million to public libraries during FY 77. Under this program \$39.9 million went for operating expenditures of these libraries and \$17.8 million for capital expenditures. Urban libraries received 57 percent of these funds. Suburban libraries and rural libraries received 19 percent and 24 percent respectively. The LSCA program distributed \$29.7 million: 47 percent to urban libraries, 14 percent to suburban libraries, and 39 percent to

rural libraries. The \$35 million of other Federal monies were spent, 65 percent in urban areas, 23 percent in suburban areas, and 12 percent in rural areas.

Two hundred forty-seven libraries reported having receipts of \$1 million or more. Over 78 percent of these libraries served a population of over 100,000, and 60 percent of these libraries were located in urban areas. Over 30 percent of all libraries had receipts of less than \$10,000, and approximately 31 percent of all public libraries had receipts of \$10,000 to \$49,999. For further details see basic tables 12 through 14.

#### Library Expenditures

Total public library expenditures for FY 77 were \$1.4 billion. Operating expenditures were over \$1.3 billion and accounted for nearly 93 percent of the total expenditures reported. Capital outlay was \$108 million. The largest of the operating expenditures was \$787 million for salaries and wages. The next largest expenditure was \$214 million for library materials. Expenditures for library materials included \$173 million for books, \$20 million for periodicals, \$4 million for microforms, and \$17 million for audio-visual and other materials. Fifty percent of the \$214 million was spent in urban libraries, 29 percent in suburban libraries, and 21 percent in rural libraries. The other operating expenditures were as follows: \$6 million for binding and rebinding; \$20 million for equipment; \$159 million for plant operation and maintenance; and \$173 million for all other expenditures.

Total expenditures per capita for 26 percent of all public libraries were less than \$3; for 50 percent, less than \$5; and for 70 percent, less than \$7. One third of all public libraries spent less than \$10,000 on operating expenditures in FY 77. Thirty percent of all libraries spent between \$10,000 and \$49,999, and 12 percent between \$50,000 and \$99,999. For further details see basic tables 15 through 19.

#### Library Collections

Over 439 million volumes of books filled the shelves of public libraries in 1978. These volumes represented over 191 million titles. Since 1974, public libraries increased their book holdings (volumes) by 13.4 percent. Large urban libraries serving over 500,000 persons increased their bookstock by 9.4 percent, and those

serving 250,000 to 499,999 and 100,000 to 249,999 increased their book holdings by 14.4 and 17.4 percent respectively. Small urban libraries serving a population of under 100,000 showed no significant change. Suburban libraries, both large and small, showed an increase in bookstock of 10.7 and 15.9 percent respectively. Rural libraries recorded a growth in their book collections of over 15 percent.

Public libraries added 26 million new volumes of books to their collections during 1978, representing over 11 million titles. The number of bound periodical volumes reported was over 6 million. Over 15 million units of microforms were reported among library holdings and approximately 800,000 new units were added in 1978. Over 55 percent of all public libraries reported less than 20,000 volumes of books. Over 32 percent of all urban libraries had from 100,000 to 299,999 volumes of books. Suburban libraries reported that over 37 percent of their collections contained less than 20,000 volumes, over 25 percent had 20,000 to 39,999, and over 16 percent had 40,000 to 69,999. Over 68 percent of the libraries in rural areas reported less than 20,000 volumes of books, and 16 percent had from 20,000 to 39,999.

Sixty-eight percent of all public libraries reported less than 20,000 titles. Over 30 percent of all urban libraries had less than 20,000 titles, and over 23 percent of all urban libraries had from 100,000 to 299,999 titles. Suburban libraries reported that over 56 percent of their collections contained less than 20,000 titles, over 17 percent had 20,000 to 39,999 titles, and over 15 percent had 40,000 to 69,999 titles. Over 77 percent of the libraries in rural areas reported less than 20,000 titles, and 13 percent had from 20,000 to 39,999 titles.

Titles of audio-visual materials were reported in three categories: sound recordings, films, and other materials. Other materials included film strips, slide sets, overhead transparency sets, mixed media (multimedia) kits, flat pictures, study print sets, maps, charts, games, etc. Approximately 9 million sound recordings were reported with over 600,000 added during 1978. Over 400,000 motion picture films were reported, and over 29.6 million other audio-visual materials. For further details see basic tables 20 through 22.

#### Direct Circulation to Library Users

Library loans of all types of materials to users in 1978 were over 986 million. This was an increase of 93 million loans or over 10 percent since 1974. The average number of direct circulations per large library was over 1.3 million, over 67 thousand per small library. Libraries serving less than 100,000 increased their circulation by over 13 percent while larger libraries increased their circulation by only 7 percent. The smaller urban libraries increased their circulation by over 18 percent. In suburban areas, the larger libraries increased their circulation by 8.9 percent and the smaller ones by 10.2 percent. In rural areas, the larger libraries showed an increase of over 44 percent, probably due to demographic changes which brought eight libraries into these strata. The smaller libraries showed an increase of over 14 percent. For further details see basic table 23.

## Interlibrary Loans

There are two types of interlibrary loans: those made to other libraries, called in this survey "loans provided," and those received from other libraries, called "loans received." These statistics are never equal because interlibrary loans are between various types of institutions. Many public libraries borrow materials from other public libraries, academic libraries, special libraries, government libraries, and commercial firms. All the materials entering the library on loan are counted as "loans received." When a public library lends materials to other libraries, institutions, etc., these loans are counted as "loans provided." In 1978, public libraries reported 8.8 million interlibrary loans. Approximately 3.9 million of these loans were provided to other libraries and 4.9 million interlibrary loans were received from other libraries. The average number of interlibrary loans received by large public libraries was over 1,800 per individual library. For further details on library loan transactions see basic table 23.

## Library Use

Total attendance per week for all public libraries was estimated at over 8.5 million. In-library use of materials per week was estimated at 3.8 million transactions. Reference and directional transactions per week were estimated at over 4 million transactions, of which 63 percent were reference transactions and 37 percent were directional. For large public libraries, the average attendance count was 7,860 per week for each library. For further details see basic table 24.

## Library Hours and Days Open

More than half of all public libraries (53 percent) were open less than 40 hours per week. All but seven of these libraries were small public libraries serving less than 100,000 persons. Ninety-eight percent (327) of the larger libraries were open 40 hours or more per week, and 78 percent (262) were open 60 hours or more per week. Over half of all public libraries were open 6 days per week. Over three-fifths of all public libraries were open less than 8 hours per day in a typical week. For further details see basic tables 25 and 26.

## Library Physical Facilities

The total net area in square footage assigned for library purposes was approximately 79.9 million square feet for all public libraries. The total length of shelving space available for library materials was over 54.4 million linear feet. A total of over 713,000 seats were available to library users. For further details see basic tables 27 through 30.

## Conclusion

Public libraries are serving over 8.5 million people each week and are circulating all types of library materials - books, paperbacks, phonograph records, films, graphic, prints, art, paintings, and even sculpture, at the rate of 986 million direct circulations per year. Local governments are spending over \$1.17 billion per year on library services to their communities. The Federal government distributed over \$57 million to public libraries through the Revenues Sharing Program during FY 77, and distributed \$29.7 million through the Library Services and Construction Act. Approximately 4 million reference questions were answered by librarians in 1978, and in-library use of materials exceeded 3 million. Over half of all the professional staff in public libraries have graduate degrees.

## APPENDIX A. METHODOLOGY

## SOURCE OF DATA

The estimates are based on data obtained from a sample survey, the Survey of Public Libraries, LIBGIS III, conducted by the National Center for Education Statistics (NCES). The data collected were for fiscal year 1977 and fall 1978. The universe of public libraries was updated in 1977 in preparation for the survey. The size of the universe was 8,456 public libraries in the 50 States and the District of Columbia. The population size categories ranged from "under 10,000" to "500,000 and over" population served. The national sample selected initially was 1,505. However, 7 libraries were ineligible for various reasons, and the final sample was 1,498 public libraries. The response rate was 87.8 percent or 1,315 libraries.

## STRATIFICATION AND TABULAR PRESENTATION CONTROLS

For use in the Survey of Public Libraries, LIBGIS III, the public library universe was stratified by (1) regions - North Atlantic; Great Lakes and Plains; Southeast; and West and Southwest; (2) location - Within SMSA, Central; Within SMSA, Other; and Other than SMSA; and (3) the population of the area served - 500,000 and over; 250,000 to 499,999; 100,000 to 249,999; 25,000 to 49,999; 10,000 to 24,999; and under 10,000.

The tabular presentation of the data for this survey is within the confines of the above controls as seen in the aggregate tables. The following further describes these controls:

#### RELIABILITY OF THE ESTIMATES

Since the public library estimates are based on a sample, they may differ somewhat from the figures that would have been obtained if a complete census had been taken using the same schedules, instructions and enumerators. The standard errors primarily indicate the magnitude of the sampling error and do not measure any systematic biases in the data. Particular care should be exercised in the interpretation of estimated numbers based on a relatively small number of cases or on small differences between estimates because of their relatively large standard errors.

#### SAMPLING VARIABILITY

The standard errors are primarily measures of sampling variability, that is, of the variation that occurred by chance because a sample rather than the entire population was surveyed. The sample estimate and its estimated standard error enable one to construct confidence intervals, ranges that would include the average results of all possible samples with a known probability. For example, if all possible samples were selected, each of these surveyed under essentially the same general conditions and using the same sample design, and an estimate and its estimated standard error were calculated from each sample, then:

1. Approximately 68 percent of the intervals from one standard error below the estimate to one standard error above the estimate would include the average result of all possible samples.
2. Approximately 90 percent of the intervals from 1.6 standard errors below the estimate to 1.6 standard errors above the estimate would include the average result of all possible samples.
3. Approximately 95 percent of the intervals from 2 standard errors below the estimate to 2 standard errors above the estimate would include the average result of all possible samples.

The average estimate derived from all possible samples is or is not contained in any particular computed intervals. However, for a particular sample, one can say with a specified confidence that the average estimate derived from all possible samples is included in the confidence interval.

A library was regarded as metropolitan or "Within SMSA" if it was located in a county defined as a Standard Metropolitan Statistical Area (SMSA). In New England, SMSA's were determined on the basis of towns, rather than counties. A library located outside of the SMSA was classified as nonmetropolitan or "Other than SMSA."

Metropolitan libraries were further defined as "central" or "other:" (a) if coterminous with or located within the boundaries of a central city (the large city comprising the hub of the SMSA), it was classified as Within SMSA, Central, (b) if located within the SMSA but outside the central city, it was classified as Within SMSA, Other, and (c) if, as in some large county systems, the population of a central city (1970 census) within the county library system was 50 percent or more of the county population, the system was regarded as Within SMSA, Central, if less than 50 percent, Within SMSA, Other.

SAMPLE SELECTION

A sample of 1,498 libraries was selected from a universe of 8,456 central public libraries. The 334 libraries serving a population of 100,000 or more were sampled with certainty. The remaining 1,164 libraries in the strata were arranged in a cyclical manner according to their population served, i.e., region 1 - high to low, region 2 - low to high, region 3 - high to low, and region 4 - low to high. The libraries in the strata were then partitioned into zones having approximately equal aggregate populations. Two libraries were then selected at random from each zone.

Population estimates were obtained by weighing the sample data by the inverse of the library's probability of selection. Estimates for nonrespondent libraries within a zone were imputed based upon the data from the peer libraries in the zone that responded or from peer libraries in adjoining zones.

All the statements of comparison appearing in the text are significant at a 90 percent confidence level or better, and most are significant at a 95 percent confidence level. The estimates for the larger libraries serving a population of over 100,000 are from a universe of these libraries and are not subject to sampling error. The smaller libraries serving a population of less than 100,000 are from a sample and are subject to sampling error. Totals involving both the larger and smaller libraries are also subject to sampling error.

The table of standard errors does not include all variables from the survey. Comparisons to the previous survey and percent change are mentioned only in the text when standard errors were available for those items and the change was shown to be significant. In the case of the earned degrees of librarians, the standard errors for total professional staff were used to determine significance. There were no standard errors calculated for public service outlets, library expenditures, library collections other than volumes of bookstock, use of in-library materials, reference and directional transactions, interlibrary loans, library days and hours open, and library facilities. Individuals using these estimates should be aware that they are subject to sampling error although the magnitude of this error is not known.

#### INSTITUTIONAL TABLES

Those libraries serving over 100,000 inhabitants are listed by State in the first five tables of this report. From the 334 libraries in this group, there were 38 nonrespondents. These libraries are listed but data imputed for the aggregate tables are not used in the listing.

The institutional tables 1-5, display data on public service outlets, per capita data for operating expenditures for books and other library materials, number of books held at end of year, loan transactions, and data on staff per 10,000 population. Data are presented for the full-time-equivalent (FTE) numbers of library professional staff by sex and highest degree earned, other library staff, and the plant operation and maintenance staff. Data are presented for total receipts, operating expenditures, and capital expenditures for these large libraries.

#### NATIONAL AGGREGATE DATA TABLES

Tables 6-30 contain national aggregate data, based on the national sample of 1,498 libraries that was inflated to national estimates. The items in stub for these tables are arranged in the following sequence: (1) All Public Libraries; (2) Within SMSA, Central; (3) Within SMSA, Other than Central; and (4) Other than SMSA.

These four stub groupings are further subdivided as follows: 500,000 and over; 250,000-499,999; 100,000-249,999; 50,000-99,999; 10,000-49,999; and under 10,000. The number of libraries in each of these subdivisions is given in the second column of each aggregate table. There are no standard errors for the portion of the sample serving a population of less than 100,000 for basic tables 6, 7, 13, 15-19, 22, and 25-30.
